

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans



PARKING ON DOUBLE YELLOW LINES One of our neighbours on Copse Hill has contacted us to say that cars parked on double yellow lines close to Christ Church on Sundays have caused difficulties and danger to road users and residents. We know full well it can be awkward to find a convenient parking spot on a Sunday morning but we must be good neighbours and not cause any difficulty for nearby residents and, of course, we must fully observe the parking regulations which stipulate it is illegal to park on double yellow lines at any time. There is almost always safe and legal parking available on High Cedar Drive off Copse Hill, a few minutes' walk from the church.
